

## Plot construction of the novel, "Where Angels Fear to Tread"

There is sign of youthness in the whole novel. According to H.V. Routh the plot has just a touch of inventiveness. He translated his problem of spiritual misunderstanding into the boldest relief. Forster, the humourist is aiming at something which is fundamentally human. The continuation of life as compared symbolised by their child who dies within a year, and the mother within a few days. This significance is absurd by the complexities of the story with its socio comic episode which is unexpected and inevitable.

Other merit of the plot of this novel is intricacies gradual changes in characters, wit and satire. Evidence of construction is seen in the way of the world of Shastona and Monteziano meet and draw apart again.

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
